Dear Prime Minister

I am approaching you because:

2010

- You were reported in The Sunday Telegraph of 24 January 2009 as having said *"I strongly support the right of law-abiding people to defend themselves, their families and their properties... As a country, all our instincts and sympathies rightly lie with law-abiding citizens. Society sides with the victims of crime, so too should the system. And I am determined that it will"*.
- My experience of the last eight years, which started with a fraudulent 'service charge' demand of £14,400 for my leasehold, basement, studio flat, overwhelmingly demonstrates that, in spite of my being the innocent victim of crime, and a law-abiding, honest, decent, taxpaying British National – 'the system' has, and continues to be most definitely against me.

To this effect, I enclose copy of my 2 February 2010 letter to Sir Paul Stephenson, Met Commissioner; The Rt. Hon. Alan Johnson, Home Secretary; Sir Malcolm Rifkind, MP; Mrs Ann Abraham, Parliamentary and Health Ombudsman – in which I have added detail for your benefit (and that of other parties copied on my letter).

I am afraid it has resulted in a rather long letter, which relates my experience with:

- Kensington and Chelsea police, and the outcome – to date – of my bringing events to the attention of Sir Paul and Mr Johnson.
- The London Leasehold Valuation Tribunal, West London County Court, Wandsworth County Court, the Supreme Court Costs Office, and HMCS 'Customer Service' following my complaints (which, in 2004, entailed a 'cry for help' to Lord Falconer of Thoroton and, in 2007-08, two 'cries for help' to The Rt. Hon. Jack Straw, Justice Secretary – as well as being copied on related correspondence).
- My MP, Sir Malcolm Rifkind, following my approaching him to refer my complaint against the Court Service and the tribunal to Mrs Abraham, and the outcome – to date – of my experience with Mrs Abraham's Office,

Prime Minister: will you show your *"determination"* in my case for 'the system' to – finally – treat me as per my statutory rights?
