Dear Ms Rawe

I am writing about the application made by Metropolitan Police Service to dispense with the complaint you made on the 7th December 2009.

The IPCC has considered the application and your letter of 18th February 2010. Based on the information and evidence provided we have agreed that it would not be appropriate to investigate because you have not provided a good reason for the delay between the incident and the making of your complaint and investigating your complaint now would likely cause an injustice.



The IPCC also considers that your complaint is an abuse of the complaints procedure because the misconduct complaints system does not exist in order for changes to be made to old crime reports. An application to the Information Commissioner might be a more appropriate way to address this issue, if there is any way to address it.



Furthermore the IPCC considers that it would not be practical to investigate your complaint because of the substantial amount of time that has passed since these events occurred.

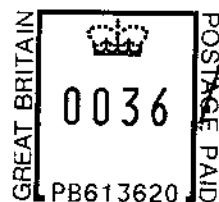
As a result, we have agreed to grant a dispensation. This means the police do not have to investigate this matter. We have told the Metropolitan Police Service of this decision.
