I sent you a letter on 5th May (attached) supported by comprehensive appendices requesting your assistance in relation to an investigation by the police.



Letter to Sir Toby
Harris-5May...

I have not heard anything since then, and wonder whether it is because your department cannot assist.

Since writing to you, on 23rd May, DC Adams told me that:

- anonymous phone calls from the landline number - of which there were three - were made from the Carlton Tower Hotel
- he said that, as in the case of the calls made from the mobile number (of which there were 17) the calls had been made by Mrs [REDACTED]
- He added that, as Mrs [REDACTED] had received a warning for the calls made from the mobile phone, he considered the matter close.

I pointed out to him that this made a total of three different explanations from the police:

1. Firstly, I was told that the calls had been made from my phone. When I challenged this, the police said that something must have gone wrong with the BT voicemail system, and it had dialled my phone by mistake (He agreed, and said they had apologised for this error)
2. That there was no subscriber for the number, and hence that BT had got it wrong
3. And now this latest version (The reply was: "not my fault if our unit got it wrong before")

As in the case of the calls from the mobile phone, I view this explanation as suspect: it suggests that Mrs [REDACTED] booked a room in the Carlton Tower Hotel; possible, but given that she has a large, 2 bedroom flat, 100 meters from the Carlton Tower, this is rather odd. At least, this information will be easy to verify. (If it is true, then I am impressed that the police managed to trace the calls)

Aside, from this, I am, as before, very uneasy about the alleged involvement of Mrs [REDACTED]. To my mind (and supported by the various evidence I previously sent you), I believe the perpetrator to be Andrew David Ladsky.

I would very much appreciate communication from your department as to whether or not it can pursue this matter
